# **MILITARY ABBREVIATIONS**

- Abbreviations, acronyms and initialism are shortened versions of words and phrases used to save time.
- Acronyms are which form the initial Itr of words in the particular phrase (UNICEF United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund).
- ➤ Initialism is a shortened form of words or phrase pronounced as a series of letters (IMF International Monetary Fund).
- Be sure to use the **appro abbn** at the **correct place**; since a misuse can lead to a **miscomm**. E.g.: Category (cat).

- Abbreviations given in the Jt Mil Abbn Manual is auth to use in written staff wk.
- Learn commonly use abbn and must be consistent in their use in a particular paper/doc/svc corres.

# **RULES**

- Be consistent throughout the doc and tables as well as in the text. No sentence should commence with an abbn.
- Do not use **punctuations** in or after abbn except when it is part of **normal sentence punctuation**.
- Rule 3. Abbreviations for most units of measurement remain unaltered in the plural; 'min' means 'minute' or 'minutes' and 'kg' means 'kilogram or kilograms'.

- Rule 4. Some abbn indicate both the singular and the plural forms and do not reqd the addition of 's'. For an e.g. Exercise/s Ex, Battalion(s) bn(s).
- Rule 5. An apostrophe could be used even with an abbn to indicate possession. For an e.g. Officers' Mess, is abbreviated as Offrs' Mess.
- Rule 6. Names of loc/towns should be abbreviated as per the accepted and regularized list of abbn and all other loc are to be written in full. For an e.g. MONARAGALA, is abbreviated MNG and DIYATALAWA is abbreviated DLA.

- Rule 7. Any composite noun or one containing a suffix or prefix is to be abbreviated by abbreviating the part for which there is an auth abbn; e.g. 'mob' (mobilization) 'demob' (demobilization).
  - A prefix is a gp of letters placed before the root of a word (proactive, illegal).
  - A suffix is a gp of letters placed after the root of a word (comfortable, hour ly).
- Rule 8. Abbreviate terms used with No. For e.g. 101 BC, AD 1200.



- Rule 9. Rules regarding use of blk capitals and initial capitals apply as fols:
  - Abbreviations **composed** of initial letter of words (**Acronyms** and **Initialisms**) are to be written in **blk capitals**; for e.g. '**ATC**' for 'Air Traffic Control'.
  - Abbreviations consisting of **shortened version of a full word** or **words** are to be **written in blk capitals**, with **initial capitals** or in **word case** according to the relevant context, such as:
    - Abbreviated words as a **main or gp heading**. For e.g. RECCE REP, OFFR.
    - ✓ Abbreviated words as a para heading. For e.g. Recce Rep, Offr.
    - Abbreviated words in the **text of a para**. As e.g. recce rep, offr.

- Abbreviations for **all 'ranks'** are to be written with **initial capitals**, **irrespective** of the **context**. For e.g. Lieutenant Colonel ABC Silva as **Lt Col** ABC Silva.
- When **No of words in conjunction are abbreviated** which is not as acronym or initialism and forms a pronounceable word it should be **written in upper case**. For e.g. **cas**ualty **eva**cuation as **CASEVAC**, **Ci**vil **Mi**litary **C**ooperation **as CIMIC**.
- Abbreviations leading to confusions shall be avoided at the discretion of the originator. For e.g. using of abbn 'No' for number will create confusion with English word 'no' in a para.



#### Rule 10. As fols:

- Any word that does not have an official or internationally accepted abbn cannot be used in the text.
- Owing to the **length** and the **No of times** that the **same words appear** in the **text**, it **may be abbreviated** at the **first time** that such words are **introduced**. e.g. Bangladesh Military Academy (**BMA**).
- Newly intro abbn should be used in the text.

- In all types of svc doc except formal, directed and DO ltr.

# POINTS OF THE COMPASS

- The four cardinal pt of the compass are written in full. Example **South**.
- For intermediate pt, letter N,S,E and W are used. Example- **SW**, and **NE**.

# SECURITY CLASSIFICATIONS

- Security cl should not be abbreviated.
- 'RESTRICTED' and 'CONFIDENTIAL' will be abbreviated as 'RESTD' and 'CONFI' only in the conf minutes.

# MILITARY SYMBOLS

#### What is a mil symbol?

A mil symbol is a **graphic sign** used, usually on a **map**, **display** or **diagram** to rep a particular **mil unit**, **instl**, **activity** or **other item** of **mil interest**. It may be in **colour** and accompanied by **alphanumeric** characters.

**Alphanumeric Characters** 

Numbers 0-9

Letters A-Z both uppercase and lowercase

- The **use of mil symbols** confined to marking:
  - In sit or int maps, overlays and air photos notation.
  - Naval and AF maps when involved in land Ops.


## **GUIDELINES TO USE MILITARY SYMBOLS**

- In case **no symbols exist** or a **combination of symbols** would **not** be **clear**, the **symbols used must be explained in a map key**.
- Symbols must be kept as **simple** and **clear** to prev misunderstanding.
- Over elaboration is to be avoided and clarity to be maint.




# **COLOUR REPRESENTATION**


**Blue**. For friendly units, instl, eqpt, activities and gr environment symbols.



Red. To indicate en units, posts, instl, eqpt, activities and gr environment symbols.



Green. For both friendly and en man-made obst.




Yellow. For both friendly and en NBC events.






When one colour is used due to the **non aval of colour** reproduction facilities, in such occasions symbols are indicated as fol:




# UNIT, POST, AND INSTALLATIONS


Any **fmn, unit or sub-unit** is rep by a rectangular flag symbol.



A HQ or an elm of a HQ is rep by a basic flag symbol, placed on a shaft on its lt.




> An **OP** is rep by a triangular symbol.







An admin or log instl is rep by a circular symbol.



An elect instl is rep by a downward facing triangular symbol.








## SOLID OR BROKEN LINES

> Symbols marked with solid lines indicate **pres or** actual loc.



> Symbols marked with broken lines indicate future or projected loc.





# **LOCATIONS OF UNITS, POSTS AND INSTALLATIONS**

At the pt of the **shaft for HQ** (2 or more symbols can be placed on one shaft).

> At the **centre of the bottom** of a basic symbol.

At the end of a 'loc vector' (note that the symbol can be offset from its actual posn).

> By bracketing a gp of units etc, if they are co-loc, against a single 'loc vector'.


# **ROLE INDICATORS**

A symbol, or composite symbol containing two or more types, may be placed within the basic symbol to show the type of unit, post or instl.






## BUILD UP OF MILITARY SYMBOLS

- The starting pt is the **basic symbol**.
- The **svc arm/corps** is marked inside the symbol.
- The size symbol is placed on the top.
- If it is nec to illustrate the **functional cap** the appro symbol may be **super-imposed over the basic symbol** or if clarity demands placed under it.





To the **rt** of the symbol is written the **designation of the fmn/unit/parent unit** together with the abbn for any **spl cap/role**.



To the **It** of the symbol, **sub-unit designation** is written equivalent to size symbol.




Intervening **echs of comd** are indicated by using their designation separated by **oblique strokes**.

Weapons/functional symbols may be added to the **It of the basic symbol** to denote the type of sub-unit.

To show a **non-organic cbt comd** the symbol is placed over the size symbol.

### TACTICAL SYMBOLS


Boundaries are marked by a solid line with the **size of the fmn/unit** interposed at convenient intervals.


The numerical des of fmns/units may be placed on either side of size symbols on the bdry to indicate which fmns are separated by the bdry.



When bdry separates units of unequal size, symbol of large fmn will be used except rear bdry.








#### MAP MARKING SYMBOLS FOR SITUATION
